Band Financial Report

This spring and summer season, our sources of income included performance fees from the Potsdam Chamber of Commerce (\$250) and Madrid Dam Music Series (\$325). Other income, in the form of audience donations for the two



concerts, was \$623. Contributions by band members (at rehearsals) amounted to \$413, and band shirt sales totalled \$840. Expenses for the summer session included \$1,020 for the purchase of polo shirts, and \$326 for UHaul rental and gas. There were also expenses for rehearsal room rental at Crane, program and poster printing, and pizza for the librarian crew, but those numbers were not available at publication time. Thanks to your generosity and that of our audiences, we have a healthy bank balance of \$5,117.
